





Looking Back— The Winners Circle

Previously Published in the August 2004 issue of the Jottings



There's always a story to go with those beautiful cars at any Concours event. Here are the stories behind the cars and owners of the "Top Cats" at our most recent Ottawa Jaguar Concours.

In the Championship Class, competition was so keen that we had a tie for first place.

Mike Powley's 2003 X-Type was entered in Champion Division C18, tying first place in champion division with an impressive 99.91 points

Mike and RoseMarie Powley took possession of their special 2.5L X-Type Jaguar in early May of 2003. The car is beautiful British Racing Green with a Charcoal interior.



Not their first Jaguar, the Powleys previously owned a 1976 XJ6C 4.2L. This coupe was dubbed the **Purple Gherkin** for its audacious (but authentic) typical 70's psychedelic "Lavender Blue" paint (Dilly-Dilly). During Mike and RoseMarie's ownership from 1986 until 2002, the car was consistently shown at Concours events and judged shows, never placing less than 3rd, and coming 2nd twice nationally in Champion Class JCNA.

There is also a Morgan in the household; their current model is a 1972 4/4 4-seater.


Mike's local Jaguar club is CXKJR or Canadian XK Jaguar Register/ Canadian Classic MG Club; this club is unique with the two Marques under the same roof, but it really works. Mike also belongs to the UK Jaguar Drivers Club, a couple of Morgan Clubs, and a local all-Brit Car Club. As a member of CXKJR for the past 16 years, Mike has held positions of both President and Vice President.

When asked "why Jaguar," Mike says between owning Morgans & Jaguars, "we call it owning the sublime & the ridiculous", you figure out which is which! He does note, however, that both of these Marques are still in production, unlike so many other great old British cars.

Mike and RoseMarie ran several JONAT legs. While in the Mount St. Helens area on the Washington State leg, their "four wheel drive" X-Type got stuck in the snow! As Mike points out, "you Gotta read the fine print." On the topic of 4WD, the X-Type ads say "... the continuous transfer of power between all four wheels



means the X-Type helps maintain a grip on the *asphalt* so tight, it's almost ferocious." As Mike say's, "obviously does not apply to snow." The Powley's X-Type was assisted out of the snow with a tow from a 1976 XI-12C.

Both Mike and RoseMarie considered their Ottawa experience one of the highlights of the JONAT portion of their drive across Canada to Prince Edward Island. They extend their thanks to the Meet & Greet / Concours organizers, who in their opinion were well organized, displayed good judging and really had it all together.

Oh! I almost forgot: if we had an award for those who travelled farthest to our Concours event, the Powley's, having travelled all of the way from beautiful British Columbia, would surely have won this award, too. Nobody could say that this award-winning Jaguar is not a driver!

Graham & Margaret Stokes' 1998 XJR was entered in Champion Division C13, tying first place in champion division with a fantastic 99.91 points

When Graham and Margaret Stokes

set out in early 2001 to find their award-winning Jaguar, they were specifically looking for an XJR. They especially chose an XJR partly on the advice of

friends in Coventry England (nice to have friends in high places) and more specifically for its speed and power. It took about 3 months to locate the right car, their impressive 1998 version. Not only was this car, with only 19K on the odometer, in excellent condition, its Sapphire Blue colour, not normally available for this model, was obviously a special order, making it somewhat unique.

The Stokes previously owned a 1991 XJ6 that was also an award winner.

In 1992, it was JCNA North American Champion in its class! Most impressively, this car, as is Graham's current XJR, are/were daily drivers, used every day.

Graham's interest in Jaguars started in the early 70's when he was a

Production Foreman for a company in Birmingham, England. The company produced parts for Jaguars, Bentleys and Rolls Royce, one production item being the Jaguar Leaper. It was around this time that Graham decided that "one day" he would own a Jaguar. It only took about 30 years, but patience is a virtue!

Graham has been a member of the Ontario Jaguar Owners Association for about six years and shows his car a regular basis. Since being at the Ottawa Concours, John and

> Margaret have already shown their car as far away as Dawson Pennsylvania, where again, even after a long

dusty drive, they took home another 1st place trophy.

This was the Stokes' second time at the Ottawa Concours; they went home with a first place win in 2003, too. They feel that the Ottawa folks put on an excellent show and displayed great hospitality.

A sedan with an impressive 0 to 60 in 5.4 seconds that's faster than most 2-seat sportsters on the road: this car is a truly great daily driver! Great ride, Graham!

Jeff Booth's 1992 Ser. III VandenPlas V12 was entered into Driven Division D6 taking first place in driven with a terrific 99.79 points

A relatively recent purchase as Jaguars go, Jeff and his wife Connie ob-



tained this award winning '92 VDP in March of 2002. A Special Edition Version, this car is number 36 of the final 100 cars of this series that were made for the Canadian market.

This was not a first Jaguar experience for the Booth's, as Jeff previously owned a Mk V and a Mk VII. As Jeff says, "that was about 25 years ago and he wishes that he still had them." There is also a 1971 Ser. III E-Type 2+2 at home, and wow!! that one was a 25th anniversary present from his wife Connie. (Right about now, I'll bet that all of the guys are saying, "Honey, you should read this!")

Jeff is currently an active member and Vice President of the Ontario Jaguar Owners Association. Jeff is also Chairman of their Concours d'Elegance and notes that "this is where the real work is." Jeff also supports the British Sports Car Club, in Hamilton, Ontario, and the British Saloon Car Club of Canada.

When asked why the Booth's have chosen Jaguar as their favourite marque, Jeff states that it is because of Jaguar's styling elegance, perform-

ance, higher-level of engineering and overall quality, along with its fascinating position within the motoring community. That pretty much covers all of the bases, and why not?

Being a Concours d'Elegance Chair himself, Jeff's opinion of our Ottawa Concours event is much valued. Jeff felt that the Ottawa Concours was "first class." Ottawa Concours participants and members were friendly, embracing and inclusive in every regard. Ottawa was a super experience.

John and Lori Scopis' 1967 E-Type was the winner of Ottawa's unique "Distinctly British Award".

A special and unique award at the Ottawa Concours is the "Distinctly British" award, chosen and presented annually by the British High Commissioner to Canada.

This year's award went to **John Scopis** for his beautiful 1967 E-Type.

John has owned his award winning E-Type for almost eleven years. In these eleven years, John has made the trip to Ottawa and presented this car at the Ottawa Concours no less than eight times.

A member of the Ontario Jaguar Owners Association, this is John's first and only Jaguar. However, he is considering adding an XK8 to the family at a future date.

John's desire for a Jaguar started in university. A friend owned a red Series 2 E-Type and he always thought that it was

one of the most gorgeous looking cars in the world. Once he started looking for his own, it took about 2 years to find the right one. Although requiring significant work, his find was mechanically sound, and now obviously beautifully restored.

Being a regular at the Ottawa Concours generates a lot of "just getting there" stories. One of John's favourites was a trip to Ottawa with his daughter shortly after putting a new top on the car. John had worked extremely hard to ensure that it was watertight; unfortu-

nately, the weatherman decided to test it out with torrential rains all the way. At one point, and with almost as much water inside the car as out, John had to stop and apply duct tape to the top of the windscreen. They were no sooner underway again when an 18-wheeler passed him and sucked the left windscreen wiper off! Before they could retrieve it, another

18-wheeler had driven over it. Things were not looking good for this trip.

However, after arriving in Ottawa, John


