

On a good news note, Al Graves and Jay Hunt have agreed to handle the Activities Role, planning next years drives and activities.





I case you missed it, here are some of the Cumberland Heritage Museum's highlights:



Watson's Garage c. 1932 Cumberland Village


The Watson family settled near Bearbrook in the 19th century. At the beginning of the 20th century, a branch of the family moved to Camberland where they operated a hotel.

John Watson built a single story, whod-frame building with shiplap siding as a bicycle repair shop (the right side of the current building). It was located at the corner of Dunning Road and Old Montreal Road in Cumberland. He added a large repair bay when he expanded his business to cater to the fuelling and repair of automobiles. Mr. Watson was one of the first licensed mechanics in the province of Ontario.

The Watson garage was moved to the Museum in 1990 and is furnished with automobiles, equipment and tools dating back to the 1930s. It is one of the oldest surviving Imperial Oil stations in Canada.

The August 12th—15th Trip

The OJOA Concours and Rural Ontario Highlights

OJC August Adventure Featuring OJOA Concours, Canadian Warplane Heritage Museum -August 12th -15th, 2022



This year's 4 day mini-vacation and tour was the first since 2018 and had as its highlight the OJOA Concours Show in the Canadian Warplane Heritage Museum, in among the vintage aircraft. In addition we visited several other places-of-interest including the Royal Botanical Gardens at Burlington, Bobcaygeon's Settlers' Village, a National Historic Site in Peterborough, a chocolate outlet in Campbellford and more. The events and stops split each day's driving into typically 90 minute – 2 hour segments, to keep the overall pace a comfortable tour. We started out

with four cars, a fifth joined us for a while at Bancroft and a sixth at Creemore.


The tour departed from the parking lot of PJ's in Arnprior on the morning of Friday, 12th August and ran through to the late afternoon of Monday, 15th August, covering just under 1,200 km over 4 days for a leisurely freeway-free average of just under 300 km/day, as shown in the map. The four day format was chosen due to the distance to the Canadian Warplane Heritage Museum, so as to allow us to have a reasonable driving distance each day while mainly using enjoyable, lightly travelled, good-driving roads rather than long driving days or driving on a freeway.

Day 1 – Friday, August 12th

We departed from Arnprior, driving up the back roads through Braeside and Castleton to Renfrew, then on to Bancroft for our first stops, being at Bancroft's Mineral Museum and for a quick lunch at Subway. After lunch we drove the relatively short leg to Bobcaygeon via Buckhorn. In Bobcaygeon we visited the Kawartha Settlers Village which represents what life was like for the early settlers from 1830 to 1935. The map and images on the next page show the village.







After we left the village via a quick stop at Tim Horton's it was on to our overnight stop at the Best Western Mariposa Inn in Orillia. This day's drive covered about 360 km with a scheduled 4 hr 34 mins of driving in three stages.

Day 2 – Saturday, August 13th

We left Orillia after breakfast for the first, fairly short leg over to Creemore, a pretty village to the west of Barrie.





After a 50 minute stop we pressed on south through Fergus to our lunch stop at "Stacked Pancake House" in Guelph. After lunch we pressed on to the Royal Botanical Gardens at Burlington, where we toured the Hendrie Garden. Leaving the gardens we took a short 30 minute drive to the Best Western in Brantford, the OJOA's chosen hotel for their members, where we were welcomed by the OJOA and joined them for a pre-Concours dinner reception at 6 pm at the hotel. This day's drive covered about 266 km with a scheduled 3 hr 41 min of driving in four stages. The RBG gardens and the OJOA Concours Reception are shown on the next page.




Day 3 – Sunday, August 14th

The Concours organization was truly impressive and ran very smoothly, with around 60-70 cars present on site. Some truly remarkable cars were present. I had never seen an XJ220 up close and here was one of only 6 XJ220S's.

The Canadian Warplane Heritage Museum was founded in 1972 to restore, preserve, display, and fly historic warplanes flown by Canadians between the start of WW2 and today. The Museum has approximately 50 aircraft, plus a gift shop and an exhibition gallery. The Museum catered a lunch for Concours participants cafeteria. After



the Awards Ceremony we left our new friends in the OJOA and headed out on a back roads drive from the Museum to our hotel in Newmarket. Sunday's drive covered about 192 km in a total of about 2 hr 47 min of driving in two stages, which were separated by the Concours event.

Day 4 – Monday, August 15th

On the last day we drove home, via the Peterborough Lift

Lock Historic Site plus a visit to the small town

of Campbellford, home of the Blommer chocolate factory and its outlet store plus a deep river gorge with a pedestrian suspension bridge. After Campbellford we headed to Marmora for a Tim Horton's pit-stop/coffee break, before heading home. The day's drive covered about 360 km in about 4 hr 50 min of driving in four stages – the end of a great and varied 4 days.

OJC's Treasurer: "Job Description"

The Treasurer of The Ottawa Jaguar Club has the following responsibilities:

- A. To provide fiduciary responsibility for the financial accounting of funds by the Club held in a business bank account.
- B. To receive income from all sources, primarily from Club Members annual membership fees, and to deposit such income in the Club books of account and in the Club bank account.

- E. To provide a monthly financial report to the Board of Directors and an annual report to the Membership as part of the Annual General Meeting in November each year.
- F. To prepare a statement of account including income and expenses and a balance sheet to the Club's auditors for an annual audit. The auditors at the time of preparation are Club Members with accounting backgrounds.

Training for this position will be provided by the outgoing Treasurer.

The success of the Club depends on active participation.

Looking Back— Phil's Magical Mystery Tour

Phil's Magical Mystery Technical Tour

lub Chief Tekkie Phil Karam decided to shake things up a bit by organizing an all-day tour on 16 August of various auto-related businesses in the local Ottawa area. Being a Wednesday, the day started with the usual club hearty breakfast at Dunn's where a dozen members carbed-up for the full program ahead. The extensive day included:

Donnelly Ford Collision Centre – tour of their aluminum body repair facility;

Kenny U-Pull – DIY auto recycling on a grand scale; DIY Garage – rental bays and equipment for DIY'ers; Chez Karam – Phil's place for wire wheel-related activities and a BBQ; and Chez Dave Batten – updates on his E-type and TR3 restora-

tion projects. A potential Carleton Raceway Cruise Night visit to conclude the

day was abandoned due to space issues with the Ottawa Ex set up.

Donnelly Ford Collision Centre

(1325 Johnston Road, off Hunt Club). This vast facility comprising 20,000 square feet provides a comprehensive, up-to-date body repairs on all makes of cars. The shop manager pointed out that they maintain extremely high standards; all work is life time guaranteed; painting involves removing panels and no masking tape in the shop. The focus of our visit however was their new "aluminum room", a self-contained shop for aluminum repairs only. With numerous manufacturers turning to aluminum body panels and structures (including Jaguar and Ford's best-selling F150) the need for dedicated facilities is growing. As the shop manager emphasized, contamination of the aluminum and its integrity can be compromised (with warranty implications) if tools used for work on

regular steel panels are also employed on aluminum. Accordingly, the aluminum room has its own sets of tools and equipment. They frequently encounter cars repaired elsewhere where the contamination issue isn't known or possibly ignored. The problem can also be encountered with dry dent removal where metal rods used to re-profile aluminum panels

can scratch and compromise the inner structure.

Kenny U-Pull (120 Bentley Drive). The Ottawa facility is one of 13 franchises in North America with 15,000 cars in yards available for DIY parts recycling. The inventory is available online broken down by make, model and part. Large selections of items like batteries and wheels & tires are maintained together. Tools are available for rent. There is a \$3 fee to visit the site and wander around. The area is well organized. On the visit day, there were few European cars and no Jags.

DIY Garage (2678 Mac St.) This small business provides garage space, hoists and tools for DIY'ers to work on their cars. A bay rental, including jack, jack stands and access to tools is \$20/hour. Hoist rental with tools and oil disposal is \$30 an hour (+tax) or \$240 a day for nine hours. A mechanic on hand is available for advice/assistance for a fee. There is free secure outdoor storage if more than a day is needed; indoor storage is \$20/day (www.diygarageottawa.ca)

<u>Chez Karams</u> The travelling circus then proceeded to Phil and Fadia Karam's lovely home off Hunt Club for the latest in a series of Phil's tech lectures...this time dealing with wire wheels. Phil demonstrated his homemade wheel knock-off cap removal device (vice the usual hammer)... letting physics and the lever principle

do the work. He also showed us an ominous tub of brown liquid in which he immersed dirty, rusty wire wheels, connected the device electrically, to result in shiny, clean wheels... electrolysis in action. After a quick peruse of Phil's Auto Collection and his marvelous exotic birds, we were treated to an excellent BBQ burger with refreshments amid the lovely backyard gardens.

Ontarians are eligible to claim expenses of up to \$1000 as an individual with a \$200 return, or \$2000 if you have a spouse, common-law partner or children, which provides a \$400 return.


